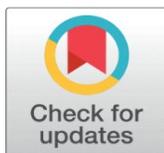
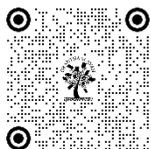


TOURISM: OPPORTUNITIES AND CHALLENGES
