ABSTRACT

After the end of colonial era, which left the world closely linked, isolated rural hinterlands started to link with communication which gained momentum in 2nd half of twentieth century, wherein newly untied settlements indulged in restoration & reconstruction. Our rural areas ought to be developed into places that are sustainable in terms of social, economic, and environmental aspects, according to the Shyama Prasad Mukherjee Rurban Mission (SPMRM). Through the provision of economic, social, and infrastructure benefits, the Mission aims to strengthen rural communities, resulting in the country's regional development being sustainable and balanced. Its goal is to "create a cluster of Rurban villages" while "developing a cluster of villages that preserve and nurture the essence of rural community life with an emphasis on equity and inclusiveness, yet remain compatible with the facilities perceived to be essentially urban in nature." This study helps to evaluate on-ground coverage of this mission, which will lead to take the desirable strategies for the optimum utilisation of the cluster development, for the further SPMRM future cluster developments.

1. INTRODUCTION

The urban agglomeration led by the Growth- centred economies having an Urban Development Authority (UDA) & Policy involved development which is supported by its adjacent undeveloped areas with their migration & submergence into the former due to attractions, needs & helplessness, which leads to the eventual expansion of the urban centre, with the rural people dragged towards it and not so amicable attachment with the society.

Due to spatial, functional & economic transformation of rural hinterlands have led to several problems not only in rural areas but the urban areas too. Rural & adjacent fringe areas face haphazard development due to cheap land grabbing, unregulated activities, etc and they still depend upon urban centres, creating a dynamic inter-dependence, which has many adverse effects.

The expansion of urban centres will lead to more unidirectional setup of Centralized development system which may have the consequent disorder in workability. The urban centres contribute to 60 % of GDP (Gross Domestic

Product), they owe a lot to their rural areas, so there is a need of synergetic developmental approach for the regional development.

Rurbanization is the process of balancing the Transformation process of Urban centres & its contiguous hinterlands. In simple words, "Making Urban spaces more rural & making Rural spaces more urban, and promote a sustainable urban well-being."

As a result, the Shyama Prasad Mukherjee Rurban Mission (SPMRM) was established in India in 2016 with the goals of promoting local economic development, improving basic services, and building well-planned, sustainable urban clusters. The SPMRM aims to develop 300 Rurban clusters with all necessary urban civic amenities in the next five years, with each cluster consisting of a cluster of Gram panchayats that will be developed as a single, cohesive entity, with approximately 100 clusters developed annually in each of the three phases. This mission endeavours to realize Gandhiji's vision of Gram Swaraj by establishing rural areas as their own republic, "independent of its neighbours for its own vital wants and yet interdependent for many others in which dependence is necessary."

1.1. PROBLEM STATEMENT / NEED FOR THE STUDY

The core concern focussed upon is Urban Development led Rural transformation which is at the root cause of all the problems for society like Poverty, Unemployment, lack of basic civic amenities yet the aspiration of its fulfilment, haphazard development in the fringe areas leading to deterioration of the Natural habitats due to absence of proper planning and so on.

1.2. AIM


My aim of thesis study is to reinforce the Rural livelihoods in several ways more effectively & the concern from urban hotspots towards its rural and what it can do is to make more natural surroundings within it and yet self-reliant centres with necessary urban amenities (capacity building) & to invoke the synergistic approach of urban towards rural development.

1.3. OBJECTIVES

The principal objectives of the study are as follows:

- 1) to evaluate the Shyamaprasad Mukherjee Rurban Mission (SPMRM) through an analysis of the Matied Ankleswar in Bharuch, Gujarat, Phase III Approved Urban Cluster.
- 2) to research the socio-demographic and spatio-economic characteristics of the cluster;
- 3) to investigate the nature of the functional relationships between the cluster and Bharuch;
- 4) to evaluate the mission-given ongoing development framework, guidelines, and methodologies of Integrated Cluster Action Plans (ICAPs) & Development Project Reports (DPRs) for the case-study area.
- 5) Evaluating potential enhancements to the growth of Rurban clusters by identifying any problems and taking the required steps to address them, as well as by investigating other strategies that might reinforce the intended result.

2. METHODOLOGY




2.1. MATIED CLUSTER (STUDY AREA) LOCATION.

The site is located in Matied cluster of Anklesvar taluka in Bharuch district.

Bharuch: Oldest city of Gujarat & 2nd oldest city in India located in the southern part of Gujarat Peninsula on the West coast of Gujarat state. The history of Bharuch dates to 8000 years ago, earlier city was a major shipping building centre and sea port in the significant pre-compass coastal trading routes to points west, nearly as far back as the days of the Pharaohs, which utilized the regular and predictable Monsoon winds or galleys.

Bharuch was certainly known to the Greeks, the various Persian Empires, the Roman Republic and Empire, and other Western centres of civilization right up until the end of the European Middle Ages, where many goods from the Far East (the famed Spice and Silk trade) were transhipped there for the annual monsoon winds making it a terminus for several key land-sea trade routes.

Figure 3 Gujarat map with Bharuch- Matied Phase III ICAP.






The Matied cluster is located on the southern part of the Gujarat peninsula on the state's west coast, in the Anklesvar taluka of the Bharuch district. Bharuch Taluka borders Anklesvar Taluka on the north, Hansot Taluka borders it on the west, and Zagadia and Valia Taluka border it on the east. There's Anklesvar and Surat nearby. Geographically speaking, the cluster is close to the Gulf of Khambhat, Aaliya Bet, and the Narmada River. The area's location attraction is enhanced by the Matied cluster's close proximity to the area's established industrial estates in Bharuch and Anklesvar, in addition to the DMIC (Delhi Mumbai Industrial Corridor). 3. CONNECTIVITY OF MATIED CLUSTER

Nearest railway station is Anklesvar & railway line passes through cluster. By road, NH64 is well connecting district headquarters Anklesvar 15 kms away and district headquarters Bharuch 37 kms away.

Bus connectivity to nearest towns & cities by Gujarat State Road Transport Corporation (GSRTC). But due to lack of bus connectivity in every village, para-transit modes of transport like auto rickshaw, jeep, etc. are there.

3.1. CHARACTERISTICS OF MATIED CLUSTER

Sajod village is the largest in the cluster, and smaller villages rely on it for essential amenities including the retail market, health care, and economic prospects. 51% of the cluster's population is tribal, and most of them depend on agriculture for their primary sources of income, which include animal husbandry and primary crops including paddy, sugarcane, pigeon peas, castor, and cotton. A significant irrigation supply for the cluster is the Ukai branch canal. Villages in Bharuch supply milk to Dudhdhara dairy under the Amul & Dudhdhara brand. Following three villages in the cluster—Haripura, Sakkarpor, and Pungam—settlement relocation occurred as a result of the 1969–1970 floods. The former settlement location was called Juna (old), and the rehabilitation of said settlement was named Nava (new). These changes

are indicated in following table & map. Sajod village now is inhabited by many settlements including Kanwa, Nangal & the rehab sites of Nava Sakkorpor and Nava Haripura. (CRDF, 2019)




Figure 6 Population Projection for 2021 of the 7 villages within Matied cluster.

Some projects that were prioritised & taken into account which were not approved in SPMRM website are as follows: E-governance centre & CSC done in all 7 villages, Provision of primary school in Haripura & Pungam and Working women hostel in Sajod decided but dropped.

4.3. IDENTIFICATION OF ISSUES

1) Management or governance issues

Issues with implementation of some projects requiring scheme convergence under other working Centrally sponsored & State sponsored schemes like MGNREGA, WASMO, SBM, GEB, Agricultural Dept. due to governing issues, scale of projects or the limited budgetary issues from CGF provision amongst the applicable Scheme Developmental Departments & the SPMRM Dept. As a result, such projects face a setback and are not implemented in a consultative, inclusive & time-bound manner. Some of the above cancelled projects need a longer time to plan, co-ordinate and execute & some projects are less relevant at this very initial stage of development but certain projects have a necessity like Agricultural related projects, household tap connections, high tension pole for intra village road connectivity.

Maybe the whole implementation of SPMRM project could be made more efficient by the involvement of PPP & also the scope but due to smaller scale of project, it is not likely promoted & just undertaken by the Government bodies at different level so the functioning isn't very perfect & there are financial deficiencies too limiting the scope of cluster developmental needs.

2) Economic issues

No time-bound manner of project implementation due to lack of timely grant of finance upon the phases of project.

3) Social issues

Public is not fully aware about their rights & the Framework of implementation of the SPMRM, due to which may be necessary suggestive ideas aren't taken from the general public being the ultimate beneficiary of the project. In other words, there is a need of more transparency with understanding village inhabitants, as it was observed in site that people know that what facilities are being provided to them, but not everyone knew that what SPMRM provides or what they are bound to be beneficial projects from SPMRM.

4.4. OVERALL FINDINGS FROM EXISTING - SITUATION ANALYSIS.

Though due to some of the projects dropped with respect to the priority of different projects & need of the cluster, limited CGF to implement projects some important projects might need a longer time to plan & implement by the development schemes, but some very important projects have been implemented and they are mitigating some issues of the cluster. However, some important projects face a setback.

The mission lays the foundation of the cluster development to remove the paucity of the very grass-root basic needs that are non-existent like schools, Aanganwadis, E-governance center, LED streetlight, sewerage lines, inter - roads development, toilets and so on. The executed projects have improved the lifestyle of the village inhabitants, just need to get 100% efficient coverage.

Of the projects that are implemented, people are more satisfied with projects of E-governance center, LED streetlight, CHC health & wellness center & sewerage while few projects either due to not in functional state, incompetency of project to fulfil the need, lacking of basic facilities in that project or unaware much about the facilty to be a beneficiary, some projects have low satisfaction level like Aanganwadi, training institute, Mahila Kaushal kendra, and sewerage lines. People are seen to be aware about the availability of the various projects benefits but they aren't are fully aware about which project benefit is being catered by which scheme, what other projects benefits they are entitled to get from SPMRM. Hence, there is a need of more awareness & participation of public in the implementation of village projects & cluster development.

There is yet a lot of basic needs of the cluster to be fulfilled like HHs drinking water pipeline, Solid waste management, water tank storage, Agriculture based projects since it's the type of cluster, high tension pole, road developments & proper bus-rickshaw stand, LED streetlight on main roads, internet wi-fi connectivity and in order to make the cluster self-reliant and upon the path of development. The development status is yet uplifting the social infrastructure of the cluster though not completely.

5. CONCLUSION

There is a need of utmost transparency & co-ordination and timely monitoring for effective execution for the respective cluster developments, at all 4 levels namely:

- 1) National level: National Mission management Unit (NMMU),
- 2) State level: State Nodal Agency (SNA), under them State Project Management Unit (SPMU) & State Technical Support Agencies.
- 3) District level: District Project Management Unit (DPMU) &
- 4) Cluster level: Cluster Development & Management unit (CDMU).

And the implementing agencies & all concerned executor Depts, beneficiary village inhabitant representatives at the broad levels of State, district & cluster management level to ensure well time-bound & integrated execution and resultantly Ideal cluster development.

The projects which directly affect the nature of the cluster (For matied: Agriculture, animal husbandry & manufacturing cluster) should be implemented, co-ordinated & monitored with respective agencies until they are executed in time-frame, for example., For agriculture, Agri processing centres, Agriculture equipment and Agriculture grants., For Animal husbandry, gauchar land, household tap connections, High tension pole for intra-village road connectivity, Water treatment plant, Solid waste management system, etc are essential for cluster development.

Owing to the transparency in cluster development at all levels & parties, necessary financial & necessary technical support to be provided by State or district level to cluster level. If needed large scale spatial plans to be made for the transformation of regional areas to increase the scale of project & thereby involvement of Private agencies with overall development. This transparency will also help in making village inhabitants aware about their developmental schemes & agenda, which can further be strengthened by digital literacy catering at household level.

Advanced mode of sustainable technologies to be utilised & inculcate for full working plan of Spatial development like GIS, Land use planning integration, etc. with adjacent region & nearby cities of clusters.

This mission has indeed given an effective forestep, for the Rurban development of cluster of villages which will initiate Planned development with the adjacent region & cities.
